- Open communication is key

	Year 6	the importance of keeping personal information safe, appropriate behaviour online and AI

# Regulations on E-Safety

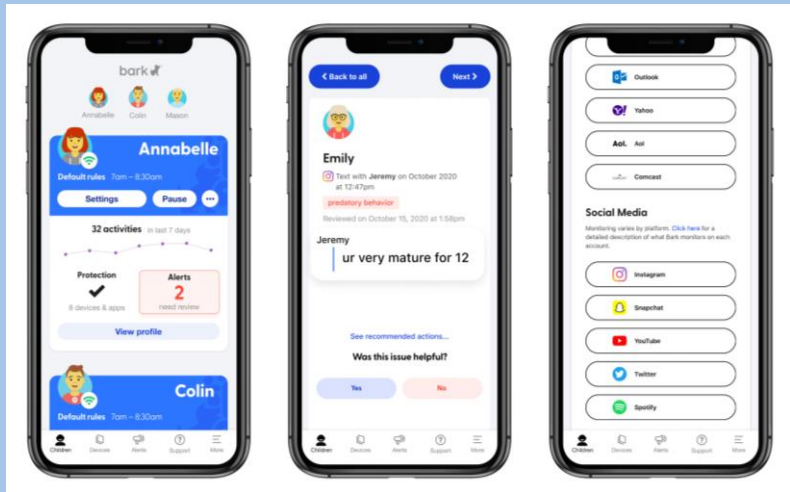
- All staff trained on key concerns

- Safeguarding policy and practices reflect digital challenges including child-on-child abuse, relationships on social media and the use of mobile and smart technology.
- Policies and training kept up to date as per KCSIE legislation


# Advice for Parents in the Digital Age

- Be active in your child's digital life – know what apps and platforms
- Set parental controls – this is not the default
- Ensure child's birthdate is accurate to ensure ads and other content is age appropriate
- Be aware of tech-tantrums and 'finsta's
- Model good behaviour and open communication
- Aim for no 'blue lights' at least one hour before bedtime.
